Drawing interdisciplinary knowledge from fields such as design, sociology, and health informatics, this workshop will equip participants with practical tools for meaningfully embedding equity in the design of digital health solutions.

Neville Board is Victoria's Chief Digital Health Officer and heads the Digital Health Branch. The Branch conducts health sector planning and assurance. The Team is implementing unique patient identification across Victorian health services, and connecting health services to the My Health Record system. The Branch is implementing the digital elements of the Mental Health and Pathology Reforms programs in Victoria, and operates Victoria's health service cyber security and ICT operational assurance programs. He chairs the Australian Digital Health Agency Jurisdictional Advisory Committee. Prior to coming to Victoria in 2018, Mr Board headed the eHealth and Medication Safety program at the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care. He also convened the WHO clinical practice working group for the Global Patient Safety Challenge Medication without Harm. Mr Board is a registered nurse and has worked in clinical, management, and informatics roles. He has published on hospital in the home, use of data in health care, short stay surgery and post-acute care.
